Memorable Moments in Diocesan History - 1820 Bicentennial 2020 – 200 years

We may be proud that Catholics in our diocese began to embrace the cause of integration when the word was still anathema to most Virginians. Fr. Thomas O'Connell of Richmond led an integrated convention of the statewide Holy Name Society in 1947; in 1948, he spoke in favor of integration before the Virginia House Courts of Justice Committee. Connell told the committee that "no true American can defend these barriers [of segregation], since colored [sic] men and women were called upon to defend America and risk their lives in defense of a common flag. They, therefore, have a right to the fundamental liberties symbolized in that flag."
