# Memorable Moments in Diocesan History - 1820 Bicentennial 2020-200 Years: (for January $26^{th}$ )

Popes from Paul III (1530s) to Gregory XVI (1830s) condemned slavery and the slave trade. This position was sufficiently widely known for Catholics in antebellum Virginia to be shunned as possible abolitionists. Sadly, Richmond's Catholics sought social acceptance by distancing themselves from this papal teaching and even, in an August 1835 meeting, publicly supporting slavery.
