This third week of Lent we ponder Accountability.

Romans 3:19-20 says: Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, that **every mouth** may be **stopped**, and **all** the **world** may become **guilty** before **God**...For by the **law** is the **knowledge** of **sin**.

What would **we** say if we stood before God, and He evaluated our lives by His law? How could **we** answer if God said, "Here is your life; here is My law; now, give an account of yourself." We could provide no excuse, explanation, or justification.

Sin is **not** a **cultural phenomenon**. It is a **divine revelation** of what is absolutely unacceptable before God in light of His holy character. "By the **law** is the **knowledge** of **sin**." Man would have no insight into this matter were it not for the law of God. "I would **not** have known sin **except** through the **law**" (Romans 7:7a). Murder, adultery, stealing, lying, coveting, etc. are all revealed to mankind by God's law.

And yet God's gives us a way to heal from sin. During Lent the Church intentionally increases opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Confession is one of two sacraments categorized as "healing". Accountability to a confessor is healthy for the soul, offering relief from shame and guilt, releasing the weight of sin-sickness. Confession is a healing encounter with Christ who quickly embraces us with His tender mercies. The demons tempt us to selfish independence and secret indulgences. We should own up to what we have done or failed to do and then we let it go into the ocean of mercy called *confession*.
