Memorable Moments in Diocesan History As Bishop Knestout emphasized in his Roanoke homily on the 200th Anniversary of the Diocese, our diocese has in many ways changed and in many ways remained the same in its 200 years of existence. We are still a small minority in a deeply Protestant state. Only 4% of the people living in the territory of our diocese are Catholic. Some Virginia counties—like Highland County—still remain without a Catholic church. At the same time—as the recent Octave of Service emphasized—the Catholics of our diocese do an incredible amount to provide education, food, and health care to all; comfort and assistance to prisoners; and outreach to migrants. We have an impact beyond our numbers, and we are a rich community with a shared history. This is the final Sunday of the liturgical year, and my final note on our history. If you would like to read more, I recommend Fr. Gerald Fogarty's book *Commonwealth Catholicism: A History of the Catholic Church in Virginia*, where I discovered the events that I have related this year.

Thank you to all the **Turkey Angels!** We have 15 as of Nov. 16th, and we need 20. But like the fishes and loaves parable, I am confident we will our 20. Thanks again, Georgia
