Town of Hurt Water Quality : Recent water quality tests for the Town of Hurt have revealed that the level of trihalomethanes (TTHMs) has slightly exceeded a drinking water standard. There is no immediate health risk and the town’s citizenry has been advised that there is no need to use an alternative water supply. However, bottled water will be available in the parish hall for those who may have specific health concerns. The towns of Hurt and Altavista are working together to coordinate the monitoring of disinfection byproducts in our distribution systems and will keep the public informed on specific solutions and the results of corrective actions. The complete report is posted on the bulletin board across from the restrooms in the parish hall for anyone to review.
