

Memorable Moments in Diocesan History - 1820 Bicentennial 2020 - 200 years

Bishop Russell of the diocese of Richmond was a pioneer in liturgical reform. Even before Vatican II, he was a great promoter of lay participation in the Mass. In February 1960, he compelled all priests in the diocese to attend a conference on the subject. He then established a diocesan commission on lay participation in the mass, requiring all parishes in the diocese to implement greater lay participation by the fall of 1960 (two years prior to Vatican II).



Feast Day September 27th. Vincent de Paul commonly known as Saint Vincent de Paul was a French Catholic priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. In 1622 Vincent was appointed a chaplain to the galleys. After working for some time in Paris among imprisoned galley slaves, he returned to be the superior of what is now known as the Congregation of the Mission, or the "Vincentians". These priests, with vows of poverty, chastity, obedience, and stability, were to devote themselves entirely to the people in smaller towns and villages. Vincent was zealous in conducting retreats for clergy at a time when there was great laxity, abuse, and ignorance among them. He was a pioneer in clerical training and was instrumental in establishing seminaries, and founder of the Congregation of the Mission and Daughters of Charity of Saint Vincent de Paul.
