Memorable Moments in Diocesan History - 1820 Bicentennial 2020 – 200 years

In the 1930s, the Diocese of Richmond sought to increase its efforts at evangelization by hosting high-profile events to explain the faith to non-Catholics. In the late 1930s and early 1940s, the diocese annually booked one of the largest auditoriums in Richmond to host apologetic lectures by Fr. Fulton Sheen (then a professor at Catholic University in Washington, D.C.). Fr. Sheen, who would later become famous as one of the most popular television figures of the 1950s, was a masterful public speaker and upwards of 4,000 people attended each lecture.
